#### HISTORY

A British-built two-door hardtop based on the mid-'50s Hillman Minx sedan platform. Won international laurels in tough rally competition for its maker, Rootes Group, and this experience showed in improvements that came thick and fast (at least by British industry

standards). The Rapier progressed from the twitchy-handling, underpowered, chunky-looking 1956-58 Series I (not recommended as a collectible) to the Series II, with better styling and a larger engine, introduced for the 1959 model year. The Series III brought still-cleaner looks, a polished walnut dash, more horsepower, and standard front disc brakes. Engine displacement and power went up again for the interim Series IIIa of 1962. The Series IV received synchromesh for all gears of the standard four-speed manual gearbox. The last Series V Rapier was equipped with a larger fivemain-bearing engine, but was not officially imported to the U.S. Despite its sporty character and fine rally record, the Rapier was overshadowed both here and overseas by the rakish Alpine twoseat sports car of the '60s, and sales were far below those of the more mundane Rootes models. Nevertheless, the Rapier is an unusual collectible for British-car fans, one of the few true hardtops from England.


# **Student Dormitory Council**
